
# Concessions in treatment charges for under privileged patients

**SCHEME**


1. The public Charitable Trust registered under the provisions of the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1919 (for short "BPTACT") which are running Charitable Hospital, including existing trusts or societies, clubs, associations or any other named for medical relief and whose annual expenditures exceeds Rs.1 Lakh are "eligible trusts" under this scheme of section 4 of the B.P.T. Act.
2. The public Charitable Trust covered by sub-section (1) shall be under legal obligation to reserve and earmark 10% of the total number of treatment beds for indigent patients and provide medical treatment for the indigent patients free of cost and reserve 10% of the total number of consultation beds of out-patient care to the weaker section patients as per the provisions of section 4.1.1.A of the B. P. T. Act.
3. In emergency, the Charitable Hospital must admit the patients immediately and provide for the patients "Essential Medical Facilities" for all the acute emergency patients and procedure 88 (admission). Further transportation to the public hospital would be arranged by such Charitable Hospital, Executive. The Charitable Hospital shall not ask for any deposit in case of admission of emergency patients.
4. The eligible trusts Charitable Hospital shall develop separate fund which may be titled "Indigent Patients Fund" for the sake of transparency. The eligible trusts Charitable Hospital shall develop separate fund which may be titled "Indigent Patients Fund" for the sake of transparency, hereinafter referred to as "IF" and shall credit two per cent of gross billings of all patients (both indigent and weaker section patients) without any deduction.
5. Donations that may be received by the Charitable Hospital from individuals or other responsible bodies or from any other source for providing medical treatment to the indigent and weaker section patients shall be credited to IF Account.
6. The amount of IF shall not be estimated under the head of IF and same shall be reflected under the estimated fund in the annual balance sheet (Schedule VI) under 121 of the B. P. T. Act.
7. The amount credited to the IF Account shall remain at the disposal of the respective Charitable Hospital and that amount shall be utilized only for providing medical treatment to the indigent and weaker section patients as provided herein after.
8. The Charitable Hospital shall provide following medical services free to the indigent patients as well as weaker section patients (i) Bed, (ii) Medication, (iii) Nursing Care, (iv) Food (if provided by the hospital), (v) Laundry, (vi) Shaves, (vii) Dentures, (viii) Routine Investigations as required for treatment of inpatient patients.
9. If House Keeping Services:
10. In case of indigent patients, the Charitable Hospital shall provide medical examination and treatment in its each department totally free of cost. The indigent patient's bill of medical services shall be prepared at the time applicable to the lowest rate of the respective hospital. The medicines, consumables and treatment to be provided at the expense of the patient. The list of medicines and treatment shall not be included in the billings of the indigent patients. The list of medicines and treatment shall be included in IF Account. The Charitable Hospital shall not ask for any deposit in case of admission of indigent patients.
11. In case of weaker section patients, the Charitable Hospital shall provide medical examination and treatment in its each department at a reduced rate. The medicines and treatment to be provided at the expense of the patient. The list of medicines and treatment shall not be included in the billings of the weaker section patients. The list of medicines and treatment shall be included in IF Account. The Charitable Hospital shall not ask for any deposit in case of admission of weaker section patients. The list of medicines and treatment shall be included in IF Account. The Charitable Hospital shall not ask for any deposit in case of admission of weaker section patients.
12. The Charitable Hospital shall periodically transfer 10% of the total patients billings (including the bill of indigent and weaker section patients) in each month to IF Account. The amount available to the IF Account, shall be spent for providing medical treatment to maximum number of indigent and weaker section patients. In case of surplus in hospital in the month of the month, the same shall be adjusted in the subsequent months. In case there is no surplus in the month of the IF Account and the expenditure incurred in the treatment of indigent and weaker section patients for more than six months, such Charitable Hospital may bring the matter to the notice of the Monitoring Committee who may have appropriate directions for the concerned hospital.
13. The Charitable Hospital shall furnish information to the office of the Charitable Commissioner regarding the amount collected in the IF Account, treatment provided by the indigent patients and the weaker section patients and their profiles prepared by the Medical Social Worker and the amount spent for the respective patients along with the information required to be sent under Rule 25.8 of the Bombay Public Trusts Rules, 1911.
14. The Trustees of the Charitable Hospital shall not provide medical facilities to their relatives, the employees of the Trust and their dependents in the hospital, Multispecialty, etc. The provisions for admission of patients shall be provided in subsequent clause.
15. The Charitable Hospital shall not admit indigent patients to the extent of 50% of their seasonal peak/average occupancy for medical examination and treatment. In case, the Charitable Hospital shall admit weaker section patients to the extent of 10% of their seasonal peak/average occupancy for medical examination and treatment. 16. The Charitable Hospital shall notify the names of the indigent and weaker section patients to the office of the Charitable Commissioner. The Charitable Hospital shall notify the names of the indigent and weaker section patients to the office of the Charitable Commissioner.
17. The Monitoring Committee at the District Level shall be as follows:
  - (i) Joint Charitable Commissioner, Maharashtra State, Mumbai. (Chairman), (ii) Joint Director of Health Services (Medical), Mumbai. (Member Secretary), (iii) Representative of Association of Hospitals in Mumbai. (Member), (iv) Health Officer, Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai. (Member).
18. The Monitoring Committee at the District Level shall be as follows:
  - (i) Joint Charitable Commissioner (Regional Level) or his nominee. (Chairman), (ii) Civil Surgeon (Member Secretary), (iii) Health Officer of 20th District (Member), (iv) Representative of Charitable Hospitals in District (Member).
19. The Monitoring Committee shall hold its meeting once in a month and monitor implementation of the scheme by each of the Charitable Hospital.
20. In case of breach of the Scheme and / or the terms and conditions of section 4.1.A of the B.P.T. Act, by any Charitable Hospital, besides the penal actions as in provided under section 4.1 of the B.P.T. Act, the Charitable Commissioner shall make report to the State Government recommending withdrawal of all Charitable Hospital P.T. Fund as occurred from the said hospital. The Charitable Commissioner may also request the Government to withdraw any other concession / benefits given to the said hospital.
21. The Charitable Hospital which does not follow the objectives / obligations under this scheme shall be at liberty to apply to the Charitable Commissioner with all supporting documents, who may consider suitable modifications, if a case for relief is made.
22. The Charitable Commissioner shall notify the list of the Charitable Hospital in Greater Mumbai Region on the notice board of the office and two notice board of the office of the Joint Charitable Commissioner and the list of Charitable Hospital in each District on the notice board of the office of the Joint Charitable Commissioner and the list of Charitable Hospital in each District on the notice board of the office of the Joint Charitable Commissioner.
23. Each of the Charitable Hospital governed by this Scheme shall publish the Scheme on its Notice Board displayed at a conspicuous place of the Hospital. Writ Petition (PIL) 1132/2004 is pending before the High Court, Bombay. The above scheme is an interim arrangement. The petition is likely to come up for hearing on 05. June 2008.
